

Character Descriptions for Cast

Bobin Hood/Black Fox: leader of the Berry Men, in love with Maid Maryawn, allergic to horses, keeps men in shape for “running” everywhere with calisthenics, wears a mask in the contest to remain anonymous. Wears a big "B on his shirt - he acts comically, super-hero-ish at times!

Little Joan: Bobin’s right hand “man,” can’t believe Bobin is blinded by “love,” jokester, riddles.

Blue: Head Berry Man, “Blue’s Clues” similarities, always looking for clues, thinking chair, notebook, “I just got a letter,” innocent and simple in speech.

Raz: One of Bobin’s Berry Men (woman), “razzes” (teases) people - especially Huck (“hits” Huck a lot).

Huck: One of Bobin’s Berry Men (woman), blonde?, cheerful/positive, a little dumb, always getting “hit” by Raz (until the end), could play it valley-girlish or cheerleaderish.

Gooze: “Arnold Schwarzenegger-like,” new to forest and the Berry Men, teased about his name, tries to fit in.

Friar Duck: religious monk type, speaks with lisp, goes between castle and forest, morale officer for Berry Men.

Sheriff Notaham: serious lawman, with shades of Elvis, collects taxes, runs contest.

Prince Frederick, the Divine: from another city, “evil,” villain, balding, mustache, wants Golden Key and throne, doesn’t really care about Maid Maryawn, perspires a lot (blue handkerchief), phony, egotistical.

King George: British accent (or enunciate a LOT), loves his contests, anxious to retire, sends everyone to the dungeon.

Queen Georgette: self-absorbed, attached sentimentally to Golden Key, energetically roots for Prince Frederick to win Maid Maryawn’s hand.

Sir Wilbur: King’s right hand man, bumbling, always getting hurt (progressively has more bandages), high voice-occasionally, clipboard with him always, secret alliance with Prince Frederick (which audience doesn’t know until the end).

Maid Maryawn: princess, daughter of King and Queen, shallow, slow, self-centered but sweet, scared of the dark (Maryawn), in love with Bobin Hood.

Lady Isadora: lady-in-waiting to Maid Maryawn, sneaky, suspicious, kleptomaniac (big pockets to hold stuff-bulging at times), doesn’t like nature or peasants.

Lilly: Maid Maryawn’s cousin, visiting the castle for the summer, caught up in romance of Maid Maryawn and Bobin, often playing with a large rag doll.

Pollyester, the Jester: Entertains, rhymes in song and dance, gives clues, mostly in between scenes but also with characters before contest, foreshadows events as well.
